
To Whom It May Concern:



3. Lieutenant James R. Sayers, Medical Corps, U. S. Navy, will act as recorder.





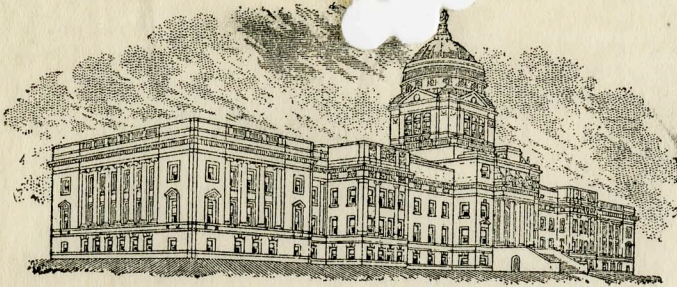

Dear sir:-

I have been intimately acquainted with Lafayette R. Hubbard for a period of about seven years. From my own knowledge of naval tradition, custom, usage, etc., I would say without hesitation that Hubbard measures up to all requirements.

I am not too well informed on his family background. I have met his father and mother, who are "Navy", the father being a Lieutenant Commander, and therefore a matter of record. I am acquainted with his wife and am sure she would be a credit to her husband in his capacity as a navy officer.

It would be unthinkable to question his sobriety, integrity, loyalty or patriotism as I know him. Above and beyond this I cannot too highly recommend him for personal initiative, quick and accurate thinking where these characteristics are needed; for his ability as an analayist of the most knotty problems that could confront him; for, aside from purely military considerations, his literary genius, his high standing in the field of writing on a vast variety of subjects.







TELEPHONE INTERVIEW WITH PROFESSOR DOUGLAS BEMENT
GEORGE WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY, ENGLISH DEPARTMENT,
19 MAY 1941.

Professor Bement recalled that about six or seven years ago the applicant was a student of his for one year. Since that time, he has been in contact with the applicant until about four years ago. Both during his university year and since, Professor Bement has known the applicant in a social way. The applicant did not finish his university work as he left school to take up free-lance writing. In this line of work the Professor felt the applicant had shown remarkable talent and had earned recognition for his work both in books and as a magazine writer. He stated that the applicant had demonstrated a willingness to do hard work and had the ability to stick to any job he had undertaken and complete the same. He felt that the applicant was rather impetuous but a very likable personality. In fact the applicant was pleasing to know, honest, sober, loyal and intelligent. He thinks that the applicant had definitely demonstrated his qualities for leadership and he was glad to add his recommendation that the applicant be given a commission in the USNR.

TELEPHONE INTERVIEW WITH PROFESSOR ARTHUR F. JOHNSON,
GEORGE WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY, ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT,
19 MAY 1941.

Professor Johnson stated that some seven or eight years ago the applicant studied engineering in his classes for about two years. Since that time he had not maintained personal contact with the applicant but he knew of his work as a writer. Professor Johnson recalled the applicant very vividly and described him as a very unusual young man, definitely not conventional but with a very pleasing personality. To remember him after such a long time indicates that the applicant made quite an impression on Professor Johnson during his time at the University. He was described as being forceful, intelligent, with definite qualities for leadership. He was among the first group of George Washington University students to earn a private pilot license. Professor Johnson spoke highly of the applicant and felt that his honesty, loyalty and sobriety would all be found exceptionally good. He was glad to add his recommendation that the applicant be granted a commission in the Naval Reserve.

1. The subject officer arrived in Brisbane via the SS PRESIDENT POLK. He reported to me that he was ordered to Manila for duty and asked for permission to leave the SS PRESIDENT POLK until a vessel offering a more direct route to his destination was available. I authorized him to remain in Brisbane for further transportation to his destination.

2. By assuming unauthorized authority and attempting to perform duties for which he has no qualification he became the source of much trouble. This, however, was made possible by the representative of the U.S. Army at Brisbane.

3. On February 11, 1942 I sent him dispatch orders to report to the Commanding Officer USS CHAUMONT for passage to the United States and upon arrival report to the Commandant Twelfth Naval District for further assignment.

4. This officer is not satisfactory for independent duty assignment. He is garrulous and ^{tries} to give impressions of his importance. He also seems to think that he has unusual ability in most lines. These characteristics indicate that he will require close supervision for satisfactory performance of any intelligence duty.





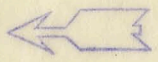

One item of £6.18.11 was noted on this bill as an overcharge. It represented two tunics which were returned to you as unserviceable and which were not and are not in my possession. These, if you will recall, were guaranteed by you to be pre-shrunk and after wearing them once, when they were cleaned they became too small to be buttoned. Your clerk was so informed and agreed with me and so received some £26.11.4 for four pairs of khaki pants, one khaki tunic, one khaki tunic remodeled, and one suit of white ducks. The two shrunk tunics which had been returned to you were stricken from this list as they were in addition to the above. Your clerk receipted my bill, which I possess, as being paid in full.

You had several days to call me back on this and I did not and do not consider the matter as my concern.

We are appealing to you, believing that your office might assist us in collecting a promissory note in the amount of \$250.00 signed by the above captioned Naval Officer.

The original amount was \$350.00 borrowed December 5th. 1940 and reduced April 3rd. 1941 to \$250.00, which amount has been renewed several times, the last being August 31st. 1941 for 90 days, due November 30th. 1941, with interest paid up to that date.

Mr. Hubbard has been notified regularly and often, and he has promised to make good the note, always in the near future. We feel that we have been very lenient with him, giving him the opportunity to get his affairs in shape, but in our last letter to him addressed care of the Explorers Club, apparently his permanent address, we informed him that we must appeal to his superiors. This notice was on July 10th. 1942, since which time we have heard nothing.

The legal rate in Alaska for interest is 8%, and there would be due, as of August 31st. 1942, \$15.00, or a total of \$265.00.

We are sorry to have to take this step and it is difficult to believe that he would put us in this position.

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of a handful of letters from you which have been held at the Club and elsewhere. I have long been aware of the delinquency of this note and the hundred dollars which I paid you upon it some time ago was, I know, paid a long time ago. Since then I have been in several places and have been subject to considerable expense.

Your last letter requesting that I pay the interest is hereby complied with. You will find fifteen dollars enclosed which will also take care of additional interest during the next month.

I have told you several times that you need have no concern about this note for I have arranged for it to be paid if anything happens to me and I am trying to pay it now. However the pay of my present rank is not the pay I received when I signed your note and the condition of war, as I have explained before, makes it very difficult for me to pay a few of the bills which were contracted prior to the war since all extra income is shut off.






Dear Sir:
