

AlNav 107 of 24 May 1945 provides as follows: "In connection with travel of dependents at own expense under Public Laws Numbers 745 and 193, Comptroller General's Decision of 18 May 1945 restricts reimbursement to expenses actually incurred not to exceed what it would have cost the Government to have furnished authorized transportation. No further payments will be made on such claims unless mode of travel is shown. Receipts or pullman stubs for rail accommodations other than coach must be furnished if available. Travel by privately owned conveyance reimbursable on itemized account of travel expenses directly incident to the operation of such conveyance with receipts if available. SecNav letter of 23 Dec. 43, page 77 of Navy Dept. Bulletin, Jan-June 44 modified accordingly. Attention invited foregoing applies only repeat enly to travel claims under above mentioned Laws. Detailed instructions will follow to claimants affected."

- 2. Prior to receiving the above mentioned decision claims coming under the provisions of Public Laws 745 and 193 have been paid on the basis of the commercial sost of first class rail transportation and authorized pullman accommodations without regard to what was actually expended by the dependents in performing the travel. Remedial legislation to permit continuing payments on the commercial cost basis is being sought from the Congress.
- 3. Since subject claim comes under the provisions of Public Law 193 as contained in paragraph 3 of SecNav letter of 23 Dec. 43, the claim will be retained in this Bureau pending action on the remedial legislation.
- 4. Should you desire, however, to resubmit your claim in accordance with the above quoted AlNav, the claim now being held in this Bureau will be returned upon receipt of an official request from you to that effect.







It has come to the Bureau's attention that in a few cases Naval Reserve officers have resigned and shortly thereafter applied for reinstatement. This indicates that some Reserve officers do not clearly understand their status in the Volunteer Reserve. It is hoped that enclosure (A) describing the general plans for the peacetime Naval Reserve will be of interest to you.
- 3. In the planned peacetime Naval Reserve you will not be called to active duty except at your own request or except in time of national emergency or war when rapid mobilization is required.
- 4. All officers of the Naval Reserve upon return to inactive duty automatically become a part of the Volunteer Reserve unless they apply for and are approved for transfer to the Organized Reserve. Members of the Volunteer Reserve will not be obligated for training, either in the weekly classes or on cruises, as required for the Organized Reserve. On the other hand they can maintain their rank and may qualify for further promotion by voluntarily fulfilling the requirements prescribed for their rank and classification. Membership in the Volunteer Reserve counts for longevity pay purposes in the event of any future return to active or training duty.
- 5. Your particular attention is invited to the fact that, should you resign your commission in the U. S. NaVel Reserve, such action would deprive you from any further benefits under the jurisdiction of the Navy Department.



A report of your examination on December 11, 1947, has been carefully considered, together with all other evidence in your case file. It has been determined that your previous rating of 10% disabled due to your duodenal ulcer condition should be confirmed and continued.

Your right shoulder condition was held 10% disabling. Your arthritis condition of the right hip, spine, and ankles was held to be 10% disabling from February 17, 1946 to December 10, 1947, and 20% disabling from December 11, 1947.

Your inflamation of the eyes condition was held to be 10% disabling. Your condition of astigmatism is not a disability for which compensation can be paid.

The condition of sprained left knee claimed by you is not shown by the evidence of record.

Your combined rating is 30% disabled from February 17, 1946 to December 10, 1947, and 40% disabled from December 11, 1947. Your award has been adjusted to pay you at the rate of \$34.50 monthly from February 17, 1946 to August 31, 1946; \$41.40 monthly from September 1, 1946 to December 10, 1947; and \$55.20 monthly from December 11, 1947. You will receive the increased amount in due course, less prior payments.

Inasmuch as increased benefits have been granted, it is presumed that you do not wish further action on your appeal.

If no reply is received from you within thirty days from the date of this letter stating that you are still dissatisfied with your rating, your appeal will be considered as abandoned, and no further action will be taken. Mr. LaFayette R. Hubbard

- 1. By reference (a) you request retirement for physical disability.
- 2. By reference (b) the Secretary of the Navy is directed to establish boards to review, at the request of any officer retired or released from active service, without pay, for physical disability pursuant to the decision of a retiring board or a board of medical survey, the findings and decisions of such board for the purpose of further adjudicating his right to retirement for physical disability. In carrying out its duties under this section such board of review shall have the same powers as exercised by the board whose findings and decisions are being reviewed.
- Naval Reserve must be permanently incapacitated for active naval service. It is to be expected that many of the officers who served in the Reserve components during the war will have aggravated a previously existing defect to a disabling degree or may have suffered a disease or injury in the service which causes a partial disability even to the point of providing a more or less serious handicap in the resumption of normal civilian activities. These officers are eligible to receive compensation from the Veterans' Administration; this was the obvious intent of Congress in providing for such compensation. An officer may not be considered for physical disability retirement, however, unless his physical incapacity is the result of an incident of the service and such that he is incapable of performing his duties at all, or in other words, he must be unable to perform them as to reasonably fulfill the purpose of his employment.

- 4. A review of your record indicates that final action on the Board of Medical Survey which considered your case on 10 September 1945 found you to be fit for duty ashore. You were examined as an incident to your separation processing on 6 December 1945 and again found physically qualified, and in view thereof it does not appear that you have incurred incapacity for the naval service while serving on active duty in the Naval Reserve.
- 5. Despite the foregoing, however, you are legally entitled to a review of the Medical Survey Board proceedings in your case under the provisions of reference (b) to further determine your right to retirement, and you should submit such request to the Chief of Naval Personnel if you so desire to exercise your legal right.

- 1. By reference (b) I am entitled to a review in my case for retirement as an officer of the Naval Reserve rendered disabled by injuries and illnesses incurred as a direct result of active service during the recent war.
- 2. Your letter reference (a) states I am so entitled. It further states I must so request it.
- 3. I request a review of my retirement case under references (a) and (b).
- 4. Prior to my entrance on active naval service in 1941 I was in excellent health. I was rendered physically incapable by service with the navy. I was separated from the service as being of no further use to it regardless of the wordings of the orders I received. No proper diagnosis of illness or physical condition was ever made by the Navy beyond a duodenal ulcer despite my complete inability to perform any part of my naval duties. I was informed by the Naval Hospital at Oak Knoll that I was recommended for retirement by their board on Sort 10, 1045 by their board on Sept. 10, 1945, a fact at variance with reference (a). I was not restored to active duty or any part of active duty on Dec. 6, 1945 but was only so ordered as a subterfuge to enable my release from service. I was offered no further hospitalization by the Navy. I spent the ensuing year in civilian hospitals at my own expense. I am without income or means of support and have been rengedered an invalid by my naval service. All my disabilities are service connected. I could perform no part of my duty as a naval officer. I cannot follow my profession or earn my living as a civilian. I owe my present useless condition to my service as a naval officer, and I look to the United States Navy to make proper and adequate recompense in accordance with the laws of Congress, customs and regulations of service and the honor of government.





The precept, copy prefixed hereto, was read.

By statement over his written signature in the petition, copy appended marked Exhibit 1(1) and 1(2), the petitioner indicated that he did not desire to appear before the Board in person and designated a representative of the above-named organization to appear in his behalf.

The following was read: A letter, dated May 19, 1948, signed by Otto C. Richter, with attached copy of an undated letter, signed by G. J. Walsh, copy appended marked Exhibit 2(1), 2(2), 2(3) and 2(4).

President of the Board:

This is the case of Lieutenant LaFayette Ronald Hubbard, which has been certified to this Board by the Chief of the Bureau of Haval Personnel. We have carefully reviewed the medical and service records and are now ready for any additional statement or evidence you may wish to present.

Petitioner's representative:

Counsel has no additional evidence to offer in this case. I would like to call your attention to the fact that the only inference to this so-called duodenal ulcer was confirmed in September of 1945. There is nothing indicating that Mr. Hubbard has been in a hospital recently, and it is my opinion that before this Board takes any definite action one way or another it would be acting in the best interest, not only of the applicant but of the service, to find out just exactly what his present condition is. I would recommend that the Board exercise its prerogative to authorize his admittance to a naval hospital for appropriete studies. That is all I have to offer in this case.

Nubhard Petitioner's representative questioned by a member of the Board: Q. It is noted that a statement accompanying Mr. Hubbard's petition, copy appended marked Exhibit 1(2), states that he spent the ensuing year in a civilian hospital at his own expense. It is presumed that he means immediately following his release. Has he furnished you with any evidence of such hospitalization? A. He has not. All that I have is an outline of an examination conducted by the Veterans Administration, showing the various ratings with the dates, copy appended marked Exhibit 2(1), 2(2), 2(3), and 2(4), but there is nothing showing that the Veterans Administration actually hospitalized him. I don't know and couldn't find in the record that any such information is available to the Board. For instance, on February 13, 1946, the Veterans Administration received from him an application for compensation on the following: Duodenal ulcer; pains in side; headaches; eyes; rheumatism (Reiters Disease); left knee sprain; conjunctivitis, active; arthritis, right hip and shoulder; recurrent malaria (see Exhibit 2(2)). On February 12, 1947, the Veterans Administration assigned the following ratings based on two Veterans Administration examinations and a letter from Dr. Walsh: Ten per cent. rating from February 17, 1946, for duodenal ulcer; ten per cent. rating from February 17, 1946, for bursitis, calcified, right shoulder; ten per cent. from February 17, 1946 until December 10, 1947; and a twenty per cent. rating from December 12, 1947 for right hip, dorsal spine, and recurrent myositis. Then they rerated him and from February 17, 1947 to December 10, 1947 gave a combined rating of thirty per cent., and forty per cent. from December 12, 1947 (see Exhibit 2(3)). The whole thing as it stands today amounts to a forty per cent. combined rating, which he is receiving on his various disabilities that the Veterans Administration presumably found to be of service origin. To my mind, gentlemen, the Navy doesn't have sufficient evidence or information that the duodenal ulcer is disabling for the performance of naval duty. I cannot offer anything else, gentlemen. I am merely interested in this applicant receiving the benefit of the doubt. The petitioner's representative desired to make no further statement. No member of the Board desired to question further the petitioner's representative. All persons not members of the Board were excused from further attendance. The Board is of the opinion that the defect for which the petitioner was medically surveyed, namely, ulcer, duodenum, is not the result of his own misconduct, was incurred in the line of duty, did not exist prior to his appointment as an officer in the U. S. Naval Reserve, but that this condition is usually remediable and does not permanently disqualify the petitioner for useful active duty in the naval service. - 1. I request that the decision of the Naval Medical Survey Review Board contained in the above reference be reviewed by the Retirement Advisory Board.
- 2. The Naval Medical Survey Review Board, meeting on June 11, 1948, repeated the retirement board decision of 1945. This decision was made without reference to 30% of my present zervice connected disability and dealt only with 10% of said disability. The more serious portion of my disability was not a part of my health record when the 1945 decision was made but was only copied into my health record completely shortly before my release from service and was repeated by further examination in my separation center medical examination. This present Naval Medical Survey Review Board had again based its entire findings on the 1945 submission which was incomplete.
- 3. The Veteran's Administration has awarded me 40% disability of which the subject of the Naval Medical Survey Review Board is only 10%.
- 4. All papers, copies of my health record, proper forms for new hearing and a copy of the Veteran's Administration letter have already been forwarded to the Navy Department and were presumably last in the hands of the Naval Medical Survey Review Board on June 11, 1948.

5. In view of my present disability, my hope is that cognizance will be taken of the actual records and conditions of this case and that retirement can be effected.

- 1. Subject officer entered this hospital on the 13th of October for complete physical examination to determine his present physical condition in accordance with authority contained in reference (a).
- 2. Upon admission Lt. Hubbard complained of chronic inflammation of both eyes with photophobia and lacrimation; pain and soreness of the right shoulder, spine, right hip and both ankles; and indigestion associated with periodic attacks of epigastric pain. These symptoms have been present more or less continually since his release from active duty December 5, 1945. Prior to separation he had been hospitalized for seven months with a diagnosis of duodenal ulcer and on September 10, 1945 a Board of Medical Survey found him unfit for service and recommended his appearance before a Naval Retiring Board. This recommendation was disapproved by the Chief of the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery and he was subsequently found physically and dentally qualified for release to inactive duty.
- 3. The routine physical examination revealed the presence of a chronic bilateral conjunctivitis of an allergic type, a compound myopic astigmatism with uncorrected visual acuity of 6/20 in each eye, some tenderness to deep palpation in the upper mid-abdomen and slight limitation of motion at the right shoulder joint. Routine blood and urine examinations were within normal limits. Special examinations of the teeth, nose, throat and ears revealed no essential deviations from the normal. X-ray examination showed normal lung fields, heart and mediastinal structures.

Film and fluoroscopic examination of the upper gastrointestinal tract indicated the presence of a tender duodenal cap which was long, defective, and which showed an inconstant crater. Films of the various joints throughout the body disclosed the presence of soft tissue calcification in the region of the insertion of the supraspinatus muscle of the right shoulder and moderate bony productive changes involving the bodies of the mid-dorsal spine. Very minimal changes of this nature were seen involving the lumbar vertebral bodies. All other joints appeared normal.

4. From a review of the medical record together with the present findings it has been concluded that Lt. Hubbard has an active chronic duodenal ulcer, a mild to moderate conjunctivitis of an allergic type, minimal to moderate osteo-arthritic changes of the dorsal and lumbar spine, and a chronic bursitis of the right shoulder with calcium deposits in or near the tendinous insertion of the supraspinatus muscle. It is considered most likely that these conditions arose while this officer was serving in an active duty status and it is believed that he is unfit for any duty at the present time but that these defects are not necessarily permanent.




